ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF APPLIED SCIENCES VELIKA GORICA

The University of Applied Sciences Velika Gorica is a higher education institution that began its operations in 2003, following approval from the Ministry of Science and Education.

The University currently offers one short-cycle study programme, five undergraduate professional study programmes, and four graduate professional study programmes.

The mission of the University of Applied Sciences Velika Gorica is to provide higher education and lifelong learning by continually developing and improving high-quality, specialised study programmes and lifelong learning initiatives based on the principles of market competitiveness, academic excellence, and social responsibility. By educating and training professionals capable of addressing contemporary challenges and labour market needs, the University contributes to the responsible and sustainable development of the community.

The vision of the University of Applied Sciences Velika Gorica is to become a recognisable and modern higher education institution that, through the uniqueness and internationalisation of its study programmes and lifelong learning programmes, competes at both the national and international levels. The main goals of the University are to provide high-quality and recognizable higher education within the European Education Area, ensure effective and sustainable management of the University and its quality assurance system, and support the University's active role at the local, regional, and national levels. The key principles in achieving these goals are **flexibility**, **innovation**, **interdisciplinarity**, **and excellence**.



FINDING YOUR WAY AROUND

The main building of the University is located at Zagrebačka 5, Velika Gorica.

Located on the ground floor are the Student Services Office, the Career and Psychological Support Center, and the University Library, which also houses a Student Reading Room.

The Dean's Department is located on the attic level of the main building. The University's facilities are fully accessible to persons with disabilities.

Classes take place in lecture halls and classrooms equipped with all the necessary equipment and technology for the study programmes offered by the University. On the first floor of the main building, there are additional classrooms and lecture halls.

Located in the new University building are faculty offices and space for external lecturers, as well as the offices of programme heads. Information about consultation hours is available in the course syllabi and on the University's website. At the end of this Guide, you will also find floor plans of the buildings to help you navigate the University more easily.

Besides the Reading Room, which is equipped with computers, there is also a Computer Corner located on the second floor of the new building next to the elevator. For relaxation and socialising, the Gaudeamus Student Club is available in the University courtyard.





On the first floor of the new building, you will find the Eco Corner, where you can enjoy beautiful and creative decorations and read useful information. The Eco Corner also includes a shelf with books and magazines available for borrowing, and you are welcome to leave books there for others to read as well.

STUDENT RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Students' rights and responsibilities are determined by government laws, the University Statute, the Study Regulations, and all other general acts of the University. Students are obligated to respect the organisation, implementation, and rules of study, the University's general acts, and to fulfil their academic duties in accordance with requirements.

STUDENT CODE OF ETHICS

Students are obliged to behave as responsible members of the higher education community by respecting the legal regulations, provisions of the University, fundamental human rights, the dignity and integrity of others, principles of equality, fairness, academic freedom, and rules of polite behaviour and decorum towards teachers and other employees, external associates and students of the University. Rights and obligations prescribed by the Code of Ethics of the University of Applied Sciences Velika Gorica refer to the actions and behaviour of students on the premises owned or used by the University, as well as the actions that present or represent the University in any way. The Code of Ethics, along with all other regulations and valid acts of the University, is available on the University's website.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

The academic calendar is a document primarily used for planning the academic year and is available on the University's website. It contains the start and end dates of the academic year, teaching periods, exam schedules, and other important information.

APPLICABLE GENERAL ACTS AND REGULATIONS

All students are required to act in accordance with the University's general acts and regulations. All general acts and regulations are available on the University's website (link: https://vvg.hr/ dokumenti/).



WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW AS A UNIVERSITY STUDENT

UNIVERSITY INFORMATION SYSTEM

The University officially informs students, faculty, and all other stakeholders about all study-related events through the University's website www.vvg.hr and the University's information system.

Students are required to regularly check messages, announcements, and documents posted on their personal portals and within the Gaudeamus system and respond accordingly.

GAUDEAMUS SYSTEM

The Gaudeamus system of the University of Applied Sciences Velika Gorica is intended for electronic learning (e-learning) by using computers and computer networks (local and Internet). It is based on the Moodle e-learning platform. Access to courses is granted by faculty members who provide passwords for course enrollment.

MICROSOFT TEAMS

Microsoft Teams enables faculty to deliver lectures and consultations via conference calls in the form of video or audio calls to student groups.

STUDENT STATUS

Student status is acquired upon enrollment at the University. Students hold this status for the prescribed duration of their studies, provided they fulfil all prescribed study requirements set by valid laws, the Study Regulations, and other general acts of the University.

Certificates of student status can be requested through the eRequests system.

CONDITIONS FOR ENROLLMENT TO THE NEXT ACADEMIC YEAR

In accordance with the Study Regulations, a student earns the right to enrol to the next academic year once all academic and financial obligations, expressed in ECTS credits, assigned during the previous year have been fulfilled.

STUDENT ID CARD

Student status is verified through an official student ID card. The student ID card contains personal data on its surface, chip, and magnetic stripe.

The student is required to present the ID card at the Student Services Office, the Library, or to faculty upon request for administrative purposes.

Any loss or damage to the student ID card must be reported as soon as possible.

ECTS CREDITS AND LEARNING OUTCOMES

The University's study programs are aligned with the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS). ECTS credits reflect the scope of learning, based on defined learning outcomes and the associated student workload. One ECTS credit corresponds to 30 hours of student work during their studies. Learning outcomes are statements that describe what a student is expected to know, understand, be able to do, or evaluate upon successful completition of a particular assignment, class, course, or programme. By attaining the learning outcomes during their studies, students acquire competencies for employment and self-employment. Learning outcomes are clearly defined for each course.

DELIVERY AND ATTENDANCE OF CLASSES

Teaching is delivered through lectures, seminars, practical exercises, individual and group consultations, mentorship, and practical training. Practical training includes working with students at teaching sites and may involve on-call duties, practical exercises, internships, fieldwork, and other forms of teaching that contribute to the acquisition of the prescribed knowledge, skills, and habits.

Classes are predominantly delivered on the premises of the University. In certain cases, classes may also be held in off-site study groups outside Velika Gorica, or in classrooms, laboratories, practical training spaces, and teaching facilities of other legal entities with whom the University has established contractual partnerships. Classes may also be delivered remotely via e-learning.

Attendance is generally mandatory for both full-time and part-time students. Student obligations regarding class attendance are regulated by the course syllabus and the Study Regulations. The Head of Course/lecturer determines possible ways of making up for any absences.

Please note that non-attendance at lectures does not exempt part-time students from other course requirements outlined in the syllabus (such as lab work, seminar papers, or fieldwork).

The class schedule is published on the University's SharePoint and is available to both staff and students. The schedule is subject to updates and may vary from week to week depending on course needs.

WHY CLASS ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Up to 75% of the final course grade may be earned through active participation during classes. Student performance may be assessed through various activities, including: participation and engagement, acquired knowledge, skills, and competencies (mid-term exams, quizzes, etc.), independent work (seminar papers, assignments, presentations, case studies, etc.), and other activities as specified in the course syllabus and curriculum. The exact breakdown of grading components is published in the course syllabus at the beginning of each course.

EXAMS

The final grade for each course is based on a combination of in-class performance and the final exam.

EXAM PERIODS

Exam periods are held in winter, summer, and autumn when classes are organised by semester. Each exam period lasts at least three weeks. Typically, a minimum of two exam dates per course are scheduled during each regular exam period. There must be at least seven days between attempts at the same course exam within a single exam period. When justified, the Dean or Study Council may schedule additional (extraordinary) exam periods.

Exam registration is done through the ISVU Studomat system.

How to register and deregister for exams?

To take an exam, you must register no later than two days before the exam date. If you decide not to take the exam after registering, you must deregister at least one day before the scheduled date.

How many times can I enrol in a course I failed?

A student has the right to enrol in the same failed course up to two times. Exceptionally, a third enrollment may be approved if there are valid and justified reasons. A student who does not pass the course even after the second or third enrollment will be dismissed from the study program. Students who do not meet the minimum requirements for exam eligibility will receive a grade of F (fail), will not earn ECTS credits, and must re-enrol in the course in the following academic year.

PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE/INTERNSHIP

The implementation of professional practice is regulated by the Professional Practice Regulations, which are available on the University's website.

COMPLETION OF STUDIES

The process of completing your studies is prescribed by the relevant Regulation, available on the University's website.

STUDENT SERVICES OFFICE

The Student Services Office is a department primarily focused on supporting students throughout their studies and helping them achieve the best possible academic experience. If you have any questions or uncertainties, this is the place to go for quick, verified, and accurate information. TEACHING STAFF

All teaching staff contact information and email addresses, as well as consultation times, are provided in each course syllabus and are also available on the University's website.

YEAR MENTORS

Year mentors assist students by offering guidance in navigating their studies. They introduce students to attendance and exercise obligations, explain how to register, deregister, and take exams, help with selecting elective courses, and provide updates on other activities at the University that promote study quality or relate to academic activities.

Year mentors follow students' progress throughout the entire program. You will meet your year mentor shortly after the beginning of the first year of study. Mentors are also available for individual meetings during regular mentoring consultation hours, which are announced by the mentors themselves.

To find out who your year mentor is, check your course syllabus. Their contact details can also be found at the end of this Guide.

CAREER AND PSYCHOLOGICAL SUPPORT CENTER

The Center offers services in psychological, academic, and career counseling. With the aim of improving the quality of student life and academic success by strengthening students' personal competencies and resources, the Career and Psychological Support Center operates at the University of Applied Sciences Velika Gorica. Students can seek psychosocial support, guidance in managing their studies, and assistance with job search at the Center.

The Center organises educational events (seminars, workshops, lectures) that help students develop different skills, achieve academic success, and care for their mental health.

The Center is staffed by psychologists with years of experience working with students and who maintain an individual approach and strict confidentiality. The Career and Psychological Support Center also ensures the inclusion and academic support of vulnerable student groups, such as students with disabilities.

INTERNATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS

Students of the University of Applied Sciences Velika Gorica have the opportunity to participate in the Erasmus+ programme, through which they can receive financial support for study visits at partner higher education institutions or for professional internships in companies across the European Union. The University currently has over 30 signed agreements with various European higher education institutions, and new agreements are continuously being added. Study mobility is divided into short-term (7 days) or long-term (one or two semesters), while internships can last from 2 to 12 months.

LIBRARY

The Library of the University of Applied Sciences Velika Gorica holds a collection of over 4,500 items of professional literature available for student borrowing.

The University also publishes its scientific journal, The Annal of Disaster Risk Science (ADRS), which is available online.

Students can borrow books upon presenting their student ID card. Books are loaned for one month, with the option to extend the loan for an additional month.

Each student may borrow up to five books at a time. All available literature supports the curriculum and study programs of the University.

An integral part of the Library is a quiet study space, i.e., a reading room with 16 seats. Students can use the reading room during the Library's regular working hours.

ACADEMIC GLOSSARY

AAI: The AAI@Edu.hr account (CARNet account) is used to access your student inbox, Gaudeamus, MS Office, the e-Citizens system, and the National Government Portal.

Academic Year: Begins on the first day of classes in October and ends with the final examination period in September of the following year.

Assistant: A teaching assistant who supports a senior lecturer in delivering lessons and other related academic tasks.

Centers: Organizational units of the University managed by a head of center. VVG includes: The Center for Career and Psychological Support and the Center for Lifelong Learning and Education.

Commission Exam: A student may take an exam up to four times. The fourth attempt is conducted before a commission. If a student fails, the course must be retaken in the following academic year.

Consultations: Designated times for one-on-one meetings between students and a lecturer to clarify course content or resolve academic questions.

Course (Kolegij): A subject taught during the semester, culminating in an exam.

Course Evaluation: Carried out through anonymous surveys to gather student feedback on teaching quality.

Dean's Department: The office of the Dean and administrative departments.

Demonstrator: An outstanding and highly successful student who, under a lecturer's guidance, helps peers understand coursework or exercises.

Department: An academic unit covering related subjects or courses.

ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System): A standardised method of quantifying student workload. At the University, 1 ECTS credit = 30 hours of student work; 60 ECTS per academic year.

Erasmus+: An international student exchange program funded by the EU. The Erasmus Coordinator provides all related information.

Examination Periods: Regular exam periods include winter, summer, and autumn terms. Additional exams may be scheduled exceptionally.

Final Exam: A conclusive evaluation of learning outcomes and student performance in a course. Details are defined in the course syllabus.

Full-Time Student: Typically someone who continues education directly after secondary school.

Hrčak (https://hrcak.srce.hr/): A central portal hosting Croatian open-access academic and professional journals. Useful for seminar and thesis research.

JMBAG: Unique Academic Citizen Identification Number, received upon enrollment. Required for administrative forms and procedures. Not to be confused with JMBG (citizen identification number).

Library: A place where students can borrow academic and professional literature for exams, seminars, and thesis writing.

Midterm (Quiz): An assessment covering part of the course content, held during regular classes.

Notes (Skripte): Student-compiled summaries or lecture notes. These are often less reliable than official materials and are not officially approved unless published by the University with peer review.

Part-Time Student: Enrolled students who work or have other responsibilities and attend classes primarily in the evenings (after 4 PM).

Reading Room: Located within the Library (main building), equipped with computers for study and research (e.g., for seminar papers). Additional computer stations are located on the second floor of the new building (by the elevator). A book-sharing shelf is available on the first floor of the new building.

Regular Exam Period: Includes summer, winter, and autumn terms. Students may take exams up to the next scheduled offering of the course.

Semester: One half of the academic year (there are two semesters per year).

Seminar Paper: A written paper on a specific topic assigned in a course. Often follows a formal structure and citation style. In some courses, it's required before the final exam.

Student Email Address: Students are encouraged to use their official student email in communication with staff and services (accessible via AAI login).

Student Services Office (Referada): The place to get essential information related to your studies. Email: referada@vvg.hr

Student Union: The central representative student body. Participates in University governance and advocates for student interests. University of Applied Sciences (Veleučilište): A higher education institution offering professional study programs.

X-ica: The student ID card used to verify status and access rights (e.g., food subsidies).

Year Mentor: Assists students in navigating university life. Year mentors are introduced in the first semester and are available for regular consultation.






FLOOR PLAN OF THE NEW UNIVERSITY BUILDING
